



# 2017-2018 Supply List

## 9-12<sup>th</sup> Grade

Fall/Spring 2017-18

---

- (7) 3 hole, 1 subject, spiral notebooks (must be able to remove ragged edges)
- (6) 3 ring binders (for handouts) – no larger than 1 ½ in.  
(10<sup>th</sup> grade students need to purchase an additional binder for Economics)
- (6) 5 or 8 tab section dividers – for placing into 3 ring binders
- (3) pkgs. 300 pages loose-leaf paper – college ruled – for placing into binders
- (1) lined composition book – (Art)
- (6) 12 page LINED Exam Books (blue/green books) – (Humane Letters)
- (6) pkgs. lined 3 x 5 index cards (for use in many classes)
- (100) sheets or (1) graph paper notebook with light lines (at least 100 pages) – (Math) (10<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> only)
- (1) 12" metric ruler – (Algebra, Art – firm, non-bendable)
- (1) 9x12" spiral bound sketchbook - (Art – may continue using same book used in 11<sup>th</sup> grade)
- (1) box #2 pencils – mechanical preferred - (Math)
- (1) box of 12 - #2 Dixon Ticonderoga or Forest Choice wood pencils (Art)
- (1) Personal pencil sharpener with shavings catcher - if not using mechanical pencils (no sharpeners in the rooms)
- (1) rectangular eraser (pink pearl or white) – (Art and for use in other classes)
- (1) pkg. Black ball-point pens – (all classes)
- (1) pkg. Red ball-point pens – (Math)
- (1) thin dry erase marker – (Math)
- (1) pkg. Highlighter pens – (Humane Letters)
- (1) Scientific calculator (see note on opposite side for details)
- (2) Notebooks with ¼" graph paper – (9<sup>th</sup> grade only)
- (1) Protractor (9<sup>th</sup> grade only)

Over .....more on opposite side.....

- (1) Small stapler and staples
- (1) Zippered pencil case to hold supplies
- NO SHARPIES OR OTHER PERMANENT MARKERS.

Optional items that would be helpful for general classroom use:

- Disinfecting wipes, Kleenex, Gallon sized Ziploc bags, Quart sized Ziploc bags, Hand sanitizer, Paper towels, Dixie cups

### **Calculator Notes from Mr. Moncada:**

All 8<sup>th</sup> through 12<sup>th</sup> grade students need a graphing calculator for math. Pay careful attention to these purchasing guidelines:

- As I will be teaching with a Texas Instruments model, it works best to buy any version of the TI-83, TI-84 or TI Nspire (non-CAS).
- **ABSOLUTELY DO NOT** purchase a TI-89, TI-92, TI-Nspire **CAS** (non-CAS is OK), or anything with a QWERTY keypad. These calculators have functions that are prohibited during standardized assessments.
- You are free to buy another brand (e.g. Casio, Sharp, HP); however, as we will be teaching based on the TI calculators and will be unable to provide support. Please contact your teacher before purchasing one of these brands to determine if it is acceptable.
- **ANY OTHER ELECTRONIC DEVICES ARE FORBIDDEN**
